Israel Firefighter Facts

- 1. The Fire and Rescue Services of Israel are called **Sherutai Kaba'ut V'Hatzalah** in Hebrew.
- 2. The Fire and Rescue Services of Israel protect all the people of Israel. (These courageous men and women are the first responders to any emergency, from a building fire, forest fire or car accident to a terrorist bomb or rocket.)
- 3. Israel's Fire and Rescue Services respond to around 80,000 emergency calls each year. During the summer a fire breaks out every 14 minutes.
- 4. Some major cities in Israel (including *Ra'anana* and *Yavne*) do not have a fire station. There are 254 municipalities in Israel but only 100 fire stations.
- 5. There are about eight million people in both New York City and in all of Israel, but NYC has 11,000 uniformed firefighters while Israel has just 1,500. (In Jerusalem, there are only 33 firefighters on call for a population of over one million.)
- 6. The average response time to an emergency call in the U.S. is around five minutes. In Israel it is more than 15 minutes more than three times that number.
- 7. Many Israeli firefighters wear outdated protective clothing and do not have access to important rescue equipment like thermal cameras.
- 8. Israeli firefighters use special compact fire trucks because they are ideal for narrow streets and equally adapt to the rough terrain of forests.
- 9. More than 70 fire trucks in Israel are over 20 years old.
- 10. JNF's efforts and donor support have helped purchase almost 150 state-of-the-art fire trucks, built several fire stations, and bought millions of dollars of new life-saving equipment and protective gear for under-funded fire departments across Israel.
