- Text study source sheets compiled from biblical and rabbinic sources about the personal and communal relationships we have with trees, for both younger and older students.

- · Parsley seed packets for each student to plant and harvest for Passover.
- The Letter to Parents that you can copy and place in each of your student envelopes. This can also be found online.
- Sticker paper for a Herzl Chia Pet activity, in which students will color Herzl and wrap him around the outside of a can (not provided). They will plant the parsley seeds inside the can.

AN OVERVIEW OF THIS YEAR'S PROGRAM

This year's theme of the program is "The Trees in your Neighborhood," in which students will learn about the attributes of different trees that are beneficial to us and to Israel. The program includes videos and links that can be accessed at home or in the classroom, so it works whether your school is virtual, in person, or a hybrid of the two.

Students will learn about their state tree and why it is important to their state, as well as the strong connection between trees and the State of Israel, through a collection of videos from JNF affiliates. Videos include Israel's national tree—the olive tree—as well as the significant role trees have played in Israel's history, like the trees that the *halutzim* (pioneers) planted, and the story of Eli Cohen, the spy who convinced the Syrian government to plant eucalyptus trees on the Golan so Israel could target them in the Six-Day War.
