Can Tourists Visit Israel Now?

As of July 20, travel to Israel for individual tourists is still paused, however plans to reopen the country should be announced soon.

Who Can Visit? Do I Need A Vaccine Or COVID-19 Test To Visit Israel?

While the situation is still dynamic and subject to change, the current plan is that when Israel opens to tourists, there will be the following requirements:

1. You must be fully vaccinated with one of the following vaccines: (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca or Johnson & Johnson) You will need to show proof of vaccination.

2. You will need to have a negative PCR test taken 72 hours before departure (at your own expense).

3. You will need to also take a PCR test at the airport and serology test and will need to quarantine until the serology test comes back (at your own expense).

Do I Need To Apply For An Entry Permit To Israel?

Yes! Each passenger is required to apply in a separate online form. No couple, family or group application will be accepted. An application must include all required documents when submitted. Applications missing any documents will be denied. For the full list of documents click **here.** Applications must be submitted 4 weeks before flight date. Applications with no proof of vaccination or recovery will be declined automatically.

Before Flying What Will I Need To Do?

1. A passport valid at least 6 months after October 10th.

2. Everyone needs their permit (link above) to board the plane and should keep it for the way back as well.

3. Everyone needs to fill out this health declaration form filled out within 24 hours of the flight <u>here</u> and print it out.

4. Everyone also needs their negative PCR test taken 72 hours before their flight

5. Print and bring a copy of your vaccine card.

6. Print and bring a copy of your proof of health insurance cover (copy front and back of your health insurance card).

What Do I Need Upon Arrival In Israel

1. On arrival in Israel, all inbound passengers must have a <u>COVID-19 PCR</u> test done at their own expense.

2. Foreign nationals will need to present Israel border control with their:

- a. Clearance issued after filling out the entry statement form
- b. Entry permit; foreign nationals will be granted entry only if they fall under an exception.

3. Everyone will have to get a serology test (a blood test to see the level of antibodies in your system from either the vaccine or a recent case of Covid-19). We will provide information on sites where you can arrange these tests.
