Goals and Objectives:


- ♣ Tours of KKL-JNF sites and projects, built from donations from our partners around the world, including heritage and historical sites.

Kibbutz Harduf

Located on a hill overlooking the Zippori stream and Ein Yivka spring in the lush Jezere'el Valley region of the Lower Galilee, Kibbutz Harduf was founded on a unique ideology of co-existence, inspiration, education and community. Today Harduf focuses on areas of education, social therapy, rehabilitation, medicine, arts, agriculture and organic food.



Akko- tour and lunch

Akko is a port city in the north, located along the Mediterranean Sea. Akko has been shaped by the Romans, Ottomans, Crusaders, Marmelukes, Byzantines, and British and today is home to a mixed population of Jews, Christians and Muslims. The Old City of Akko is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the oldest ports in the world.

Hula Valley

The Hula Valley is part of the world-famous Great African Rift Valley and is considered one of the best showcases of Israel's scenery. Located in the Upper Galilee, it is one of Israel's best destinations for hiking, bird watching, and other outdoor activities due to its unparalleled scenic views.

Ancient Katzrin Park

Located in the Golan Heights, the Katzrin ancient village and synagogue is an open-air museum that features a partially reconstructed remains of a third-century Jewish village modeled after Talmudic times.

- ▶ Nof HaGalil (Nazareth Illit) KKL-JNF House of Excellence
 A unique project to establish KKL-JNF Houses for youth in the Negev and the Galilee to
 encourage excellence and help address the inequalities between residents who live in
 the periphery and those who live in the center of Israel. This first house has been
 established in the north, and ten more are planned throughout Israel. The center fosters
 excellence, empowerment and leadership development among young people, and
 strengthens the values of Zionism and environmental conservation.

Travel to Jerusalem



- ♣ Lunch at Yad Vashem
- ★ Tour of Yad Vashem and Memorial Hall Yad Vashem is Israel's official memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. It is located on Mt. Herzl in Jerusalem and includes a museum, a library, an educational center, and

memorial sites such as the Hall of Remembrance, the Museum of Historical Art, sculptures, outdoor commemorative sites and a synagogue.

Ammunition Hill

Located in Jerusalem, Ammunition Hill is a national heritage site that commemorates the battle for Jerusalem in the Six Day war.



♣ Alexander Muss High School in Israel- Tour, visit classes and lunch. Founded in 1972, AMHSI, in Israel is the only pluralist, college prep, fully accredited program where high school students from the US and across the globe study abroad together. Their Israel studies curriculum spans 4000+ years of Jewish and Israeli history, using the land as the classroom, while the General Studies department provides a multitude of classes at various levels.



♣ 9/11 Living Memorial and ceremony

Built by KKL-JNF, the memorial was designed by award-winning Israeli artist Eliezer Weishoff. It is a 30 ft high bronze sculpture of a waving American flag that morphs into a memorial flame. It rests on a gray granite based, which includes a metal beam from the original Twin Towers. It offers visitors a place to reflect upon their thoughts and memories, and is the only place outside of NY that recognizes names and people who were killed on 9/11 as well as their countries of origin.



Mahane Yehudah Market

Often referred to as "The Shuk", this marketplace in Jerusalem has more than 250 vendors that sell fresh fruits, vegetables, baked goods, meat, cheese, nuts, seeds, spices, wines and much more. On Friday afternoon, the Shuk will be filled with shoppers preparing for Shabbat. In the evenings, the shuk becomes a center of Jerusalem nightlife with bars, restaurants and live music.

↓ JNFSderot Indoor Recreation Center

A signature project of JNF, this recreation center has provided a much-needed sense of normalcy for residents living in the hard-hit town of Sderot- located less than one mile from Gaza. We will hear how the playground has impacted the community and the lives of local families.



♣ Be'er Sheva River Park

The centerpiece of JNF's efforts to create a renaissance for the city, the River Park serves as an anchor of tourism and recreation. It includes over 6 miles of promenades, a man-made lake, and an outdoor amphitheater- now the largest in Israel.
