Opening Program at Hostage Square with Guest Speaker – Jewish National Fund-USA is a proud and strong supporter of the Hostages and Missing Families Forum in Israel. Hostage Square is the public plaza located in front of the Tel Aviv Art Museum of Art and across from the offices of the IDF. Since October 7, 2023, the families of hostages taken have encamped in the square calling attention to the plight of the hostages taken by Hamas. The square features art installations and banners calling for the release of those taken. We will hear from a representative of the Hostages and Missing Families Forum in Israel.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 7 Memorializing October 7

Breakfast at the Hotel

Yad Mordechai – Kibbutz Yad Mordechai, located within the Hof Ashkelon Regional Council and just two miles from the Gaza Border, was named after Warsaw Ghetto Uprising hero Mordechai Anielewicz. The museum on the restored battlefield site, where valiant members fought during the 1948 War of Independence, was hit by a terror rocket on October 7. It ripped a hole in the exhibit of the bunker replicating the ones used by resistance fighters in the Warsaw Ghetto. This is a poignant reminder that eighty years post Holocaust, Jews are still fighting for their lives.

Sha'ar HaNegev Athletic Center – We will lay a cornerstone at the site of the new and largest sports center in the Israel Envelope in memory of Ofir Libstein. Ofir was the mayor of the Sha'ar HaNegev Regional Council and he was murdered defending his kibbutz of Kfar Aza. His son Nitzan Libstein, mother-in-law Bilha Epstein, wife's nephew, Netta Epstein, and fifty-eight others were murdered that day. Nineteen people were taken hostage from Kfar Aza.

With these industries halted by the evacuations, many people on reserve duty and limited tourism, the region is in dire need of help. Halutza – Located in the Northwest Negev less than a mile from the Gaza border, Halutza was founded in 2005 by a group of families that left their homes during Israel's disengagement from Gaza. In partnership with JNF-USA, Halutza's pioneers laid roads, created infrastructure and housing sites, planted crops, built fields of solar energy power and more. We will meet with residents and hear how October 7th has impacted them. We will have the opportunity to plant flowers, paint with the children and tour the new community center.
